present a more sustainable production model — the circular economy — which minimises waste and

optimises resource use by incorporating reuse, repurposing and recycling of materials into

circular economy in general and during the COVID-19 pandemic in particular. Finally, it will present

some policy recommendations and discuss the role of regional cooperation in facilitating the transition
