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Batu Bersurat Terengganu (Terengganu Inscription Stone). The Inscribed Stone of Terengganu is believed to be written on 22th February 1303 and constitutes the earliest evidence of Jawi writing (writing based on Arabic alphabets) in the Malay Muslim World of Southeast Asia. The Stone is a testimony to the spread of Islam offering an insight to the life of the people of the era as well as depicting the growing Islamic culture subsumed under a set of religious laws.
