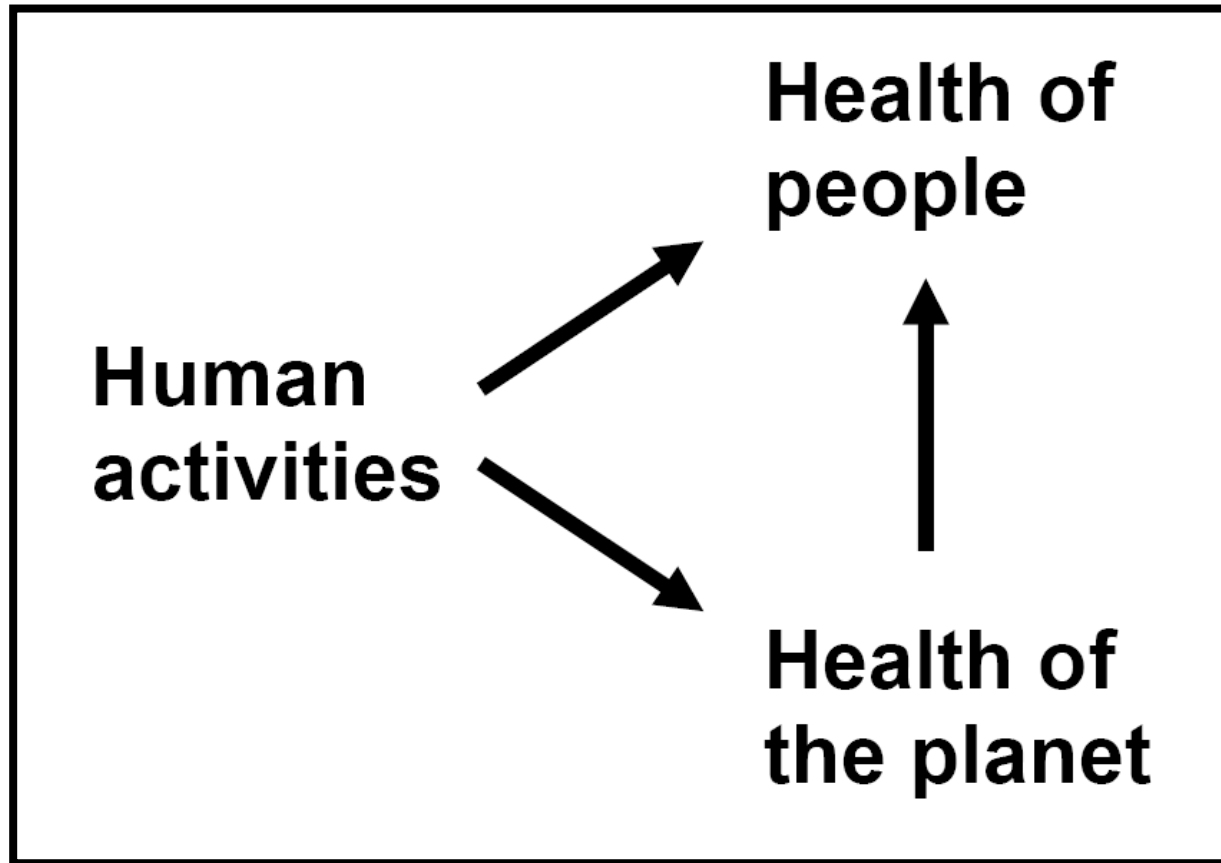

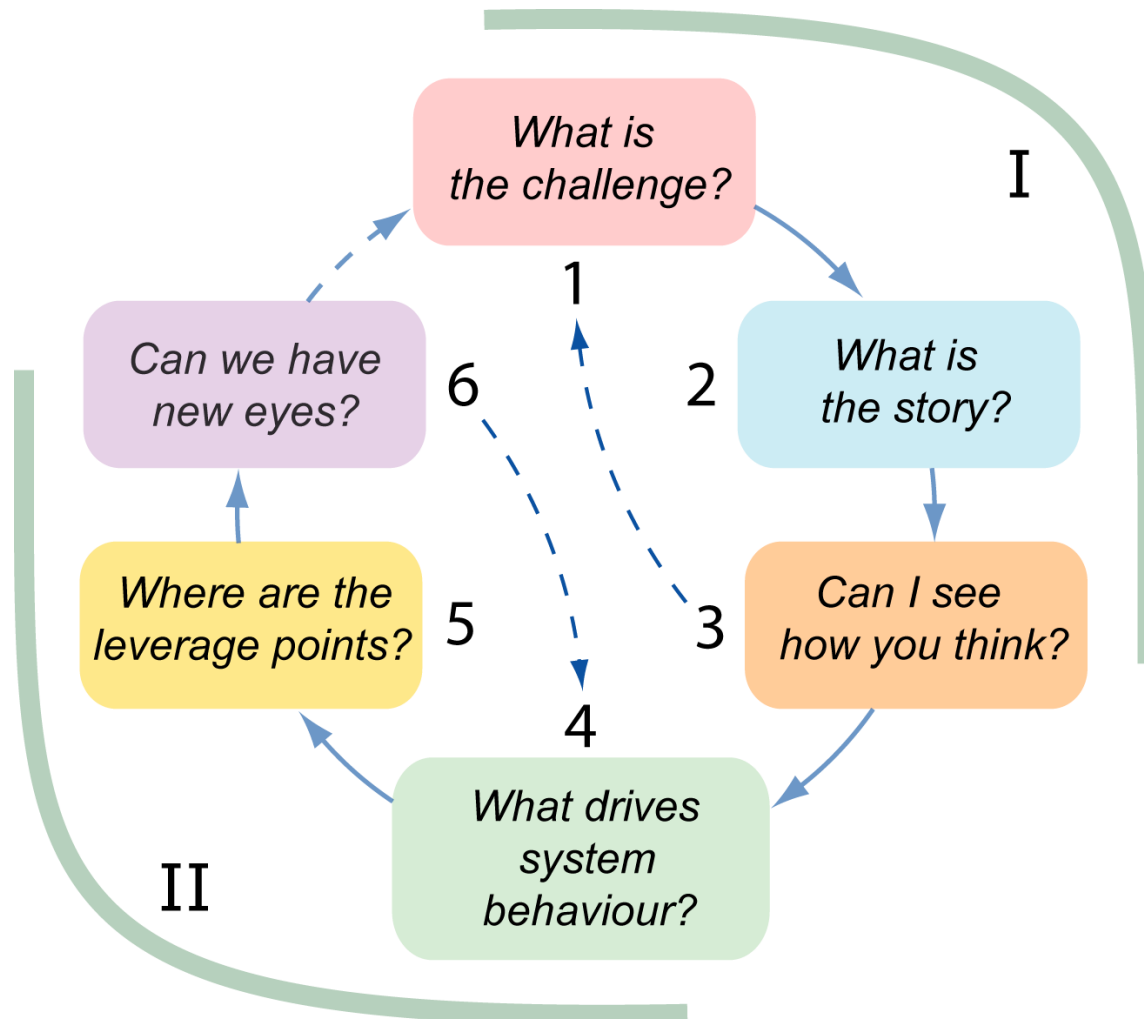

Key messages

- The post-2015 development agenda aims to integrate sustainable development and poverty eradication
- Human health and wellbeing should be understood as both an input to development and an outcome of development
- Systems thinking and human ecological approaches can help understand policy resistance and identify intervention points
- *The Lancet* is proposing 'planetary health' as fresh way of understanding health in the post-2015 agenda, acknowledging the ecological, economic and social foundations of human health and the health of civilizations
- Planetary health is conceptually cognate with sustainability science and it is timely to rethink the way human health is framed in sustainable development discourse
