ABSTRACT

Volunteerism is essential in nurturing leadership, compassion, and decision-making within communities. The Baratham Cultural Club (KKB) at the University of Malaysia Terengganu focuses on leveraging the potential of youth leaders to foster a culture of volunteerism among students, staff, and the broader community. This study explores the club's initiatives, including the Malaysian Book of Records, Fundraising Events, Multi-Cultural Nights, Mentorship Initiatives, and Health Awareness Campaigns, and their role in promoting volunteerism. Key initiatives like fundraising and public awareness programs emphasise the multifaceted benefits of volunteering. The objectives of this study are to evaluate the effectiveness of these programs in increasing community engagement, developing skills, and building social networks. It involves a mixed-methods approach, combining quantitative data on participation rates and qualitative feedback from participants. This approach helps assess the impact of both face-to face interactions and online engagement in communicating the importance of volunteerism. The results reveal a significant rise in enthusiasm and participation among students, highlighting the effectiveness of these initiatives in instilling the values of giving back and community involvement. The study finds that volunteering not only equips participants with new skills and valuable work experience but also enhances their physical and mental well being through social connections and a sense of purpose. These benefits contribute to personal growth and societal improvement, demonstrating the multifaceted advantages of volunteerism. The findings underscore the need for continued efforts to inspire and mobilize volunteers, reinforcing the transformative power of volunteerism to address social challenges and ensure a brighter future for all.

ABSTRAK

INTRODUCTION

Volunteerism has always been critical in shaping societies by fostering leadership, compassion, and community engagement. In the context of educational institutions, student-driven volunteer initiatives provide fertile ground for nurturing these qualities. The Baratham Cultural Club (KKB) at the University of Malaysia Terengganu stands as a beacon of such initiatives, actively engaging students, faculty, and the wider community in various volunteer-driven projects. This paper explores how KKB's programs contribute to personal development, skill acquisition, and the broader goal of community building.

The paper delves into the various initiatives undertaken by the club, examining their effectiveness and their impact on participants. By employing a mixed-methods approach, combining quantitative data on participation and qualitative feedback, the study aims to provide a comprehensive understanding of the role volunteerism plays in the development of leadership and community engagement.

The Baratham Cultural Club is one of the active clubs at Universiti Malaysia Terengganu. Baratham Cultural Club was established at Universiti Malaysia Terengganu in 1999 by the students. This club has organized various programs and competitions at university, national, and international levels throughout the establishment of this club. This club's students have actively participated in developing ideas and events to improve their involvement in the curricular activities. For instance, in 2014, KKB achieved the Malaysia Book of Records in the creation of the biggest 'Visit Malaysia Year 2014' logo using 28 000 coconut shells. Next in 2017, the Malaysia Book of Records was achieved again by KKB by organizing the largest recyclable domestic waste collected in a day, a total of 5.3846 tons. This legacy was continued by each highboard member of the club in each term by conducting various programs over the years. Existing programs were conducted every year and new programs were also established over recent years.

In the term 2022/2023, various programs were conducted, among them was Natyamela 6.0, a multicultural fundraising event, where I was the Program Director, which was organized to raise funds for the National Autism Society of Malaysia (NASOM) and the National Terengganu State Association for the Development of the Disabled (PAUT). We successfully donated a generous amount to this society by conducting two main events (Autism Awareness Tour, Autism Awareness Campaign, and Natyamela 6.0 Closing Ceremony) and various mini-programs to raise

funds. The Newscasting and Hosting 1.0 competition was organized as a platform for talented students in event management and news presentation. Judges from the hosting industry were invited to this program for the participants to be evaluated. They were exposed to various ways and experiences of presenting themselves and delivering texts confidently. Furthermore, the International Tamil Debate Competition 6.0 was internationally, involving students from organized other countries such as Singapore, India, and Sri Lanka. This competition aimed to unearth students' talents in the field of debate. A Colour Run competition was also conducted under the Blossom of Faith program to raise funds for the National Cancer Society of Malaysia. They successfully donated a sum of RM10,000 to this society in 2023. The Newscasting and Hosting 2.0 competition was organized in 2023 and focused on three language categories: English, Bahasa Melayu, and Tamil.

During the 2023/2024 term, under the leadership of Sri Murugan Saga Devan as the President of the Baratham Cultural Club (KKB), a total of 13 major programs and 95 mini-programs were successfully conducted. The mini-programs, held online, included awareness talks, quizzes, and poster competitions aimed at raising funds and sharing knowledge. In 2024, the Mutamizh Pongal Program was held on an international scale, with participation from international students at Universiti Malaysia Terengganu (UMT). The event received media coverage from RTM, and participants were interviewed. Additionally, Sri Murugan Saga Devan represented all Indian students at UMT in the Student Representation Congress (KORUM), where various concerns were addressed.

Another significant initiative was the LAHARA: The Tidal Tales of Triumph program, which aimed to spread awareness about sea turtle conservation. This program achieved national recognition by breaking the Malaysia Book of Records for the "Biggest Palm Print Banner," measuring 19 meters x 14.5 meters. Various mini-programs were also conducted to raise funds for the Sea Turtle Research Unit (SEATRU).

The club also collaborated with the Indian Cultural Society of Universiti Sultan Zainal Abidin (ICS UniSZA) to organize a motivational camp, *Uyarvom Uyarthuvom*, designed to instill positive change among Tamil students in SJKT Pulau Carey Timur, SJKT Pulau Carey Barat, and SJKT Pulau Carey Selatan in Selangor.In June 2024, Natyamela 7.0 was successfully held at Dewan Sultan Mizan, UMT.

Meanwhile, a Down Syndrome Awareness Campaign was organized, followed by Flashmob 2.0 in Kuala Lumpur to raise funds for the Malaysian Down Syndrome Association. As a new initiative under the Baratham Cultural Club, the 2024 Global Mobility Connect Voyages Program was introduced for the first time. A total of 19 students participated in the mobility program to Prince of Songkla University, Thailand.

Over the years, the participation of students has either been constant or has increased. The highboards for this club will be chosen every term by election and upon selection, they will conduct an interview session with selection committee members according to their exco. They will be evaluated accordingly based on their experience and several important requirements. It is important to interview to evaluate the skills, experience, and expertise of potential committee members. This ensures that individuals who have the necessary qualifications and knowledge to contribute effectively to the club's goals will be Through interviews, we can gauge a candidate's level of commitment, motivation, and enthusiasm for the role. This helps ensure that committee members are genuinely invested in the club's success. It also helps determine if a candidate's values, interests, and work style align with the club's mission and culture. A good fit is essential for smooth collaboration and achieving collective objectives. Interviews provide an opportunity to clearly outline the roles, responsibilities, and expectations associated with the committee positions. This helps candidates understand what is required and allows for informed decision-making.

A well-established club offers numerous leadership opportunities for students, from executive board positions to committee roles. These positions help students develop and showcase their leadership skills, which are valuable in both academic and professional contexts. This enriches the overall student experience by offering opportunities for involvement, personal growth, and social interaction. It provides a platform for students to explore interests, develop new skills, and build friendships, contributing to a more fulfilling and enjoyable university life. Clubs often focus on

areas like leadership, communication, teamwork, and specific professional skills. A well-organized club can provide valuable training, workshops, and experiences that help students develop competencies relevant to their future careers. This can be particularly beneficial for networking and career advancement. Strong clubs often create networking opportunities by connecting students with professionals, alumni, and other organizations. This can lead to valuable collaborations, internships, job opportunities, and mentorship, helping students build a network that can be beneficial throughout their academic and professional careers. Active clubs play a crucial role in increasing overall campus engagement. They organize events, activities, and initiatives that contribute to a vibrant campus culture, encourage student participation, and enhance the university's social and intellectual environment.



KKB's Multi-Cultural Nights celebrate diversity and promote cultural awareness through performances by students and also talented artists, exhibitions, and food from various cultures. These events broke down cultural barriers and fostered mutual respect among students and staff. The initiative included dance competitions and ticket sales to raise funds for donations.















Mobility Programme

Global Connect Voyages 2024 is a pivotal initiative by the Baratham Cultural Club (KKB) designed to extend the club's vision and mission onto an international stage for the first time ever among cultural clubs in the university. This program aims to provide KKB members from the 2023/2024 cohort with invaluable opportunities to expand their knowledge, promote Malaysian culture and Universiti Malaysia Terengganu (UMT) at Prince of Songkla University (PSU) in Songkhla, Thailand, and engage in meaningful cultural exchanges. This marks the inaugural visit by KKB to PSU, establishing a unique platform for

students from both universities to explore each other's academic programs, facilities, and cultural practices. The program will feature engaging sessions on environmental sustainability, personal development, and cultural diversity, fostering greater understanding and collaboration. Key objectives include promoting Malaysian culture and UMT, raising awareness about environmental issues, enhancing diplomatic skills, and building international relationships. Additionally, the program aims to cultivate a competitive edge among students and contribute to the global development of the Baratham Cultural Club, enriching both personal growth and the club's international presence.











OBJECTIVE OF RESEARCH

- i. To assess the participation of students in volunteerism and its role in cultivating leadership qualities and community engagement over recent years.
- ii. To evaluate the effectiveness of volunteer programs in fostering compassion, social responsibility, and leadership skills among students.
- iii. To investigate the transformative impact of volunteer initiatives on students' personal growth, leadership development, and their ability to drive positive change within communities.

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

Sustaining Volunteerism and Engagement

The club's various initiatives, such as the Malaysia Book of Records Fundraising Events, Multicultural Nights, Autism Awareness Campaign, and Down Syndrome Awareness Campaign, foster a strong sense of purpose among volunteers. These activities highlight how student volunteers can gain leadership skills, engage in community building, and influence societal issues through their positively involvement. Programs like mentorship initiatives and Natyamela 6.0&7.0 not only provide avenues for skill development but also create platforms for long-term personal growth and social contribution. Additionally, activities such as the Global Mobility Connect Voyages Program demonstrate how volunteerism expands beyond local borders, promoting international cooperation and cultural exchange.

The club's efforts emphasize the importance of volunteerism in developing compassion, leadership, and community engagement, resulting in volunteers' improved mental well-being, communication skills, and a sense of purpose. This leads to sustainable personal and social development, fostering a generation of socially responsible leaders.

SDG Goals Involved

Several Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are integral to the work of the Baratham Cultural Club:

i. SDG 3: Well-being and Good Health
 The club fosters healthier communities by supporting mental and physical well-being

through its health awareness campaigns and autism awareness initiatives.

ii. SDG 4: Quality Education

Initiatives like Uyarvom Uyarthuvom, which aims to inspire Tamil schoolchildren, support the objective of guaranteeing inclusive, equitable, and high-quality education. The mentorship programs also help by providing direction and scholastic support.

iii. SDG 10: Lessening of Inequalities

By encouraging inclusivity and equitable opportunities for individuals with disabilities, the campaigns to raise awareness of autism and support people with Down syndrome directly contribute to the reduction of inequality.

iv. SDG 13: Climate Action

The Lahara Turtle Conservation Campaign and environmental awareness activities are in line with SDG 13, which focuses on taking urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts.

v. SDG 14: Life Below Water

The Lahara Turtle Conservation Campaign perfectly aligns with SDG 14: Life Below Water, which emphasizes the need to conserve and sustainably use oceans, seas, and marine resources. By organizing a record-breaking campaign that involved 10,000 handprints and donating to SEATRU, the Baratham Cultural Club actively contributes to raising awareness about the protection of endangered species, such as sea turtles, and promotes marine conservation. The knowledge-sharing during the closing ceremony sessions further reinforce educational outreach and long-term sustainability efforts aimed at preserving marine biodiversity. Additionally, the Natyamela 7.0 event was designed to raise funds and awareness, with its final category specifically themed around SDG 14: Life Below Water. Students performed creative and cultural presentations inspired by marine life and conservation efforts, emphasizing the importance of preserving aquatic ecosystems. This initiative showcased the power of the arts in promoting environmental consciousness and further supported the club's commitment to protecting life below water. Through this thematic focus, the event not only entertained but also educated participants and the audience about the crucial need for marine preservation. vi. SDG 17: Partnerships for the Goals

By collaborating with other universities, organizations, and the international community, such as in the Global Mobility Connect Voyages, the club reinforces the importance of partnerships to achieve the SDGs.

These activities collectively illustrate the transformative power of volunteerism in achieving sustainable development, making a meaningful impact on individuals and the broader community.

METHODOLOGY

This study employs a mixed-methods approach to evaluate the effectiveness of KKB's initiatives. The quantitative component includes data collected on participation rates, the number of events held, and the financial outcomes of fundraising activities. The qualitative component involves surveys with participants, including students, faculty, and community members, to gather insights into their experiences and perceptions of the programs.

Data collection was conducted over one academic year, from October 2023 to July 2024. The quantitative data were analyzed using statistical methods to identify trends and correlations, while the qualitative data were thematically analyzed to uncover underlying themes related to leadership development, community engagement, and personal growth.

Triangulation of Data

To enhance the reliability and validity of the study, triangulation was applied in both quantitative and qualitative components:

Quantitative Triangulation

- Data were gathered from multiple sources, including club records, student participation databases, and financial reports.
- Survey responses were compared with historical club data from previous leadership terms (2022/2023 and 2023/2024) to validate trends in participation and selection processes.
- The consistency of statistical findings was cross-verified using different analytical techniques, such as percentage distributions and correlation analysis, to ensure accuracy in

identifying patterns.

Qualitative Triangulation

- Insights from surveys were cross-checked with focus group discussions conducted with students, club coordinators, and community participants to verify recurring themes.
- Qualitative findings were validated against document analysis, including meeting minutes, event reports, and feedback collected from previous program participants.
- Thematic findings from interviews were compared with observational data from club activities and leadership development sessions to ensure consistency in perspectives.

Survey Implementation and Population

This study employs quantitative methods through the distribution of survey forms to assess students' willingness to engage in volunteer activities and their perceptions of the initiatives organized by the Baratham Cultural Club (KKB) at the University of Malaysia Terengganu.

The population for this study consists of students involved in KKB's volunteer programs on the UMT campus. The total population is 346 students, and a sample size of 143 respondents was selected for this study. Responses were measured using a Likert scale: Strongly Disagree, Disagree, Not Sure, Agree, and Strongly Agree. The collected data were analyzed using percentage distributions.

Participation of students in Baratham Cultural Club (KKB)

According to the data collected from previous-term club leaders, in the term 2022/2023, a total of 78 students registered for exco selection interviews, and 49 of them were selected. Meanwhile, in the term 2023/2024, a total of 94 students came for the interview and 39 of them were selected. Every one of the applicants was evaluated based on their experience and critical thinking on how to solve problems faced by them.

Background of Respondents

The respondents consisted of 143 students currently studying at Universiti Malaysia Terengganu. The breakdown of survey participants is as follows:

• Year 1: 48 students (33.6%)

- Year 2: 66 students (46.2%)
- Year 3: 23 students (16.1%)
- Year 4: 3 students (2.1%)
- Asasi: 1 student (0.7%)
- Diploma: 2 students (1.4%)

The highest participation was from Year 2 students (46.2%). The inclusion of multiple academic levels ensures a diverse range of perspectives in the study.




FIGURE 1. The percentage of respondents according to their enrollment in UMT

Quantitative Data of Respondents

The survey was conducted among UMT students, where they were required to fill in a Google Form. The survey was divided into 4 sections, General Volunteer Experience, Leadership Development, Community

Engagement, and Future Involvement. A score was given for each question, which starts from '1' (Strongly Disagree) to '5' (Strongly Agree). Each of the respondents was required to answer all the questions given in the survey, where each section has 3 questions.




FIGURE 2. Google Form used to collect data on the survey

General Volunteer Experience

In this section of the survey, the majority of the respondents chose 'Strongly Agree' for all three questions. For Question 1, 102 (71.3%) respondents strongly agreed that they were highly motivated to participate in the volunteer activities organized

by KKB. Next, for Question 2 and Question 3, 104 (72.7%) respondents fully agreed that these activities conducted by KKB were memorable and impactful and thus they agreed that their involvement in these initiatives has positively impacted their personal and professional development respectively.




FIGURE 3: Respondents' responses on the General Volunteer Experiences section of the survey

Leadership Development

In the second section of the survey questions, it was on leadership development. Most respondents selected the option "Strongly Agree" for all three questions. For Question 1, the 103 (72%) respondents strongly agreed that the volunteer activities helped me develop

my leadership skills. Meanwhile, for Questions 2 and 3, a total of 100 (69.9%) respondents strongly agreed that they often had opportunities to take on leadership roles during these initiatives and their perception of leadership has evolved positively since they began participating in these volunteer programs respectively.




FIGURE 4. Respondents' responses on the Leadership Development section of the survey

Community Engagement

In this section on Community Engagement, most of the respondents 'strongly agree' to all three questions listed in the survey. In Questions 1 and 2, 102 (71.3%) respondents strongly agreed that they felt a strong sense of community or connection with others during these activities and that they feel more confident in their abilities and skills as a result of their involvement in these initiatives. Meanwhile, for Question 3, a total of 100 (69.9%) respondents fully agreed that volunteering has enhanced their sense of purpose or direction in life.




Figure 5.Respondents' responses on the Community Engagement section of the survey

Future Involvement

In the last section of the survey where future involvement of students in KKB programs was focused. In Question 1, a total of 99 (69.2%) respondents strongly agreed that they will continue their involvement in volunteerism after their current experience with KKB. In Question

2, 102 (71.3%) respondents agreed that they would like to see the club undertake additional activities or initiatives in the future. Finally, in Question 3, 103 (72%) respondents stated that they strongly agree that they will gladly recommend participating in these initiatives to others.




FIGURE 6. Respondents' responses on the Future Involvement section of the survey

Qualitative Data of Respondents

The qualitative data gathered from respondents provided deeper insights into their motivations, challenges, and experiences with KKB initiatives. Key themes that emerged from the qualitative responses include:

- Leadership Development: Many respondents expressed that participation in KKB helped them build confidence, enhance problemsolving skills, and develop leadership qualities through event planning and community engagement.
- Cultural Awareness: Students highlighted that KKB provided a platform for understanding and appreciating different cultural traditions, which contributed to a sense of inclusivity and respect for diversity.

- Challenges Faced: Respondents mentioned time management as a major challenge, balancing academic responsibilities with volunteer commitments. Some also noted a need for better coordination and communication within the club.
- Personal Growth: Several students shared how their involvement in KKB improved their interpersonal skills, networking abilities, and adaptability, preparing them for future leadership roles.
- Community Impact: Many participants reflected on the positive impact of KKB programs, particularly in fostering stronger connections between students and the local community through cultural events and volunteer work.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

The findings of this study highlight the significant impact of KKB's initiatives on leadership development, community engagement, and personal growth among participants. Quantitative data indicate a steady increase in participation rates over consecutive years, suggesting heightened interest and sustained engagement in volunteer programs. This trend reflects the effectiveness of structured activities and targeted outreach efforts in attracting a diverse range of students.

Qualitative insights further support these

findings by offering a deeper understanding of the participants' experiences. Many respondents reported increased confidence, improved communication skills, and enhanced leadership abilities as a result of their involvement in KKB activities. Thematic analysis of survey responses identified leadership development as a recurring benefit, with participants frequently citing opportunities to take on responsibilities, make decisions, and manage event logistics as valuable experiences that contributed to their professional growth.

Additionally, the role of cultural awareness

and inclusivity in volunteerism emerged as a key theme. Events such as Multi-Cultural Nights were highlighted as instrumental in fostering intercultural understanding and strengthening social cohesion. Respondents emphasized that these activities not only promoted mutual respect among diverse student groups but also provided a platform for meaningful dialogue on cultural heritage and traditions.

Despite these positive outcomes, certain challenges were identified. Time management was frequently cited as a difficulty, with students struggling to balance academic responsibilities and volunteer commitments. Some respondents also pointed to the need for improved coordination and communication within the organization to enhance overall efficiency. Addressing these challenges could further improve the volunteer experience and increase long term engagement.

Notably, KKB's environmental initiatives,

such as the Malaysia Book of Records-recognized turtle conservation campaign, demonstrated the club's commitment to broader social causes. The campaign, which involved the participation of over 10,000 individuals, successfully raised awareness about marine conservation and engaged students in handson environmental stewardship. Participants expressed pride in contributing to this large-scale initiative, reinforcing the notion that meaningful engagement in volunteerism extends beyond personal development to encompass wider societal benefits.

Overall, the findings indicate that KKB's initiatives have successfully fostered leadership skills, cultural awareness, and a sense of community among participants. The integration of both quantitative and qualitative data underscores the effectiveness of these programs while also identifying areas for improvement, ensuring continued growth and impact in future volunteer activities.

The findings highlight the importance of continued investment in these programs to sustain the culture of volunteerism and ensure its benefits are widely experienced. It is essential to maintain and build upon the existing support from universities and staff to further enhance the effectiveness and reach of these initiatives. Future research could explore the long-term effects of these programs on participants' career trajectories and their contributions to society. This would provide deeper insights into the sustained impact of the Baratham Cultural Club's efforts and help guide future strategies for fostering volunteerism and community engagement.

Volunteerism is a powerful catalyst for community empowerment, driven by the principles of leadership, compassion, and change. Leaders within volunteer organizations and initiatives provide direction and inspiration, while compassionate actions foster understanding and connection among community members. Ultimately, these combined efforts lead to meaningful and sustainable change, enhancing the quality of life and fostering a stronger, more resilient community.

By harnessing the collective energy and

commitment of volunteers, communities can address immediate needs, drive systemic change, and build a foundation for a better future. Through active participation in volunteerism, individuals not only contribute to their communities but also grow as leaders and compassionate citizens, reinforcing the cycle of positive change.
