



DOCTOR OF INTERNAL MEDICINE

The Doctor of Internal Medicine is a 4 year post-graduate clinical programme that is divided into three phases:

- a. Phase I Year 1
- b. Phase II Year 2 to 3
- c. Phase III Year 4

ELIGIBILITY FOR ENTRY:

- a. Age < 40 years.
- b. Registered with Malaysian Medical Council (MMC).
- c. Valid medical degree (from university recognized by MMC); or pass examination of professional registration (EPR).
- d. Pass and obtain Internal Medicine Entry Examination with Band 4 and above or MRCP part 1.
- e. Evidence of financial support from sponsors/ guarantee letter with 2 guarantors/letter of release from employers.
- f. Evidence of reference of good standing from 2 referees.
- g. Free of disciplinary action.
- h. Passed interview by MMED committee.

ASSESSMENTS:

- a. Formative Assessments Mini-clinical evaluation exercise, Direct Observation of Procedural Skill, Case-based Discussion, Multi-source feedback.
- b. Summative assessment.
- i. Internal Medicine Qualifying Assessment (Phase II)
- ii. Thesis Dissertation Written and Viva (Phase III)
- iii. Student Portfolio

Minimum of 4 years (8 Semester) Maximum of 7 years (14 Semester)



ADVANCED MASTER IN DERMATOLOGY

The Advanced Master in Dermatology programme has successfully produced dermatologists for Malaysia since 2002. The qualification is recognized by the National Specialist Register under the Malaysian Medical Council.

Programme Overview

Mode of study: This is a full-time clinical programme. Type of study: Coursework and practicum/clinical work. Duration of study: 6 semesters, maximum of 9 semesters.

Intake: June and \pm December

Language of instruction: English.

Content and structure:

Phase 1 (Year 1): Clinical training in general dermatology. Propose a dissertation research project for approval.

Phase 2 (Year 2): Further clinical training in general dermatology and dermatological subspecialty areas. Continue research project.

Phase 3 (Year 3): Assume responsibilities as dermatologist-in-training and complete research project.

Eligibility Criteria

- 1. Basic medical degree from a university recognized by the Malaysian Medical Council and Senate of Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia.
- 2. Registered with the Malaysian Medical Council and posses a Certificate of Full Registration from the Council.
- 3. A postgraduate qualification in Internal Medicine such as Master in Internal Medicine or Membership of the Royal Colleges of Physicians (MRCP) or the equivalent, and has completed the gazettement period.
- 4. International candidates are required to undergo a supervised clinical attachment (minimum of 3 months) at the Faculty of Medicine, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia with a satisfactory clinical performance.
- 5. Maximum age of 45 years.
