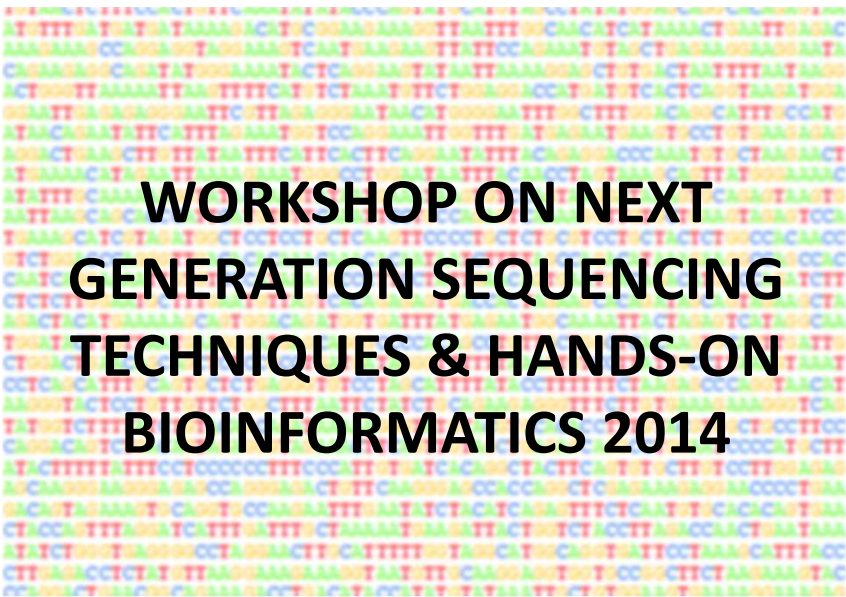

Introduction

The development of next generation sequencing techniques and applications have paved the path towards personalized medicine in health management and clinical decision making. This workshop is designed to introduce the concept to clinicians, biomedical researchers, research fellows and graduate students on how NGS based research developments are being translated into routine DNA diagnostic. This workshop will also provide participants the exposure to NGS data analysis and results interpretation, tailoring medical treatment to the individual characteristics of each patient.

Invited Speakers and Instructors



Dr. Marcel Nelen is a clinical laboratory geneticist heading the Core Genome Analysis Laboratory of the Human Genetics Department at the Radboud university medical center Nijmegen, The Netherlands. In close collaboration with the Genome Research group headed by Dr. Joris Veltman this laboratory was the first to perform exome sequencing in a diagnostic setting. Dr. Nelen got his training as a clinical laboratory genetics at the Department of Medical Genetics, UMC Utrecht, the Netherlands where he was responsible for the diagnostic implementation of ArrayCGH. Prior to that, he worked as a postdoc at the Department of Cell Biology (Radboudumc) studying the role of DNA repair in repeat expansion diseases (i.e. Myotonic Dystrophy).



Dr. Kornelia Neveling studied Biology at the Heinrich-Heine-University in Düsseldorf, Germany, and subsequently performed her PhD in Human Genetics at the Julius-Maximilians-University Würzburg, Germany. In her PhD thesis, she studied the molecular causes and consequences of genetic instability syndromes, with a special interest in Fanconi anemia. In 2009, she started as a postdoc in the research group of Joris Veltman at the Department of Human Genetics of the Radboud university medical center Nijmegen, where she learned all about next generation sequencing.



Dr. Christian Gilissen has a master's degree in computer science and works as a post-doc in bioinformatics within the Translation Genomics team. He is specialized in the analysis of Next Generation Sequencing data and interpretation of single nucleotide variation. In 2012 he was awarded the Young Investigator Award by the Dutch bioinformatics consortium for his thesis on the identification of disease genes through next generation sequencing methods. In 2013 he obtained a Dutch veni grant to study bioinformatics methods to interpret single nucleotide variants in relation to disease. Recently he received the international Isabelle Oberlé award for his work on whole genome sequencing of patients with intellectual disability.
